#### Year 7, 8 & 9 Activities Week 2025

We are excited to announce details of our 2025 Activities Week, which will take place during the last week of term, from Monday 14th to Thursday 17th July. Activities Week is an excellent opportunity for our Key Stage 3 students to engage in a wide range of exciting and enriching experiences, both on and off site. A booklet with information was emailed to parents last week. Please let the school know if you have not received it.

Some trips have been rolled into two-day packages; others are day trips. Please note that some have limited spaces, which will be allocated on a first-come, first-served basis. Full details regarding costs, deposits, and how to secure a place are included in the booklet. If certain activities prove especially popular, we will endeavour to add more spaces where possible, as detailed in the booklet.

To ensure fairness, bookings for all activities will open from 6:30 PM on Monday 9th December via our online School Gateway payment system, which can be accessed via the website or by following this link: <a href="https://login.schoolgateway.com/0/auth/login">https://login.schoolgateway.com/0/auth/login</a>.

If you do not already have access to School Gateway or have forgotten your password, please contact us as soon as possible.

To support families in paying for activities, we have split payments for all activities over £5.00 into 3 payments: a deposit payment due at the time of booking, and two further payments in March and May. We recognise the proximity to Christmas may be difficult for some families, and so have tried to ensure initial deposit payments are as low as possible. Unfortunately, we do have to ask for these payments at this time to secure spaces on the trips.

Later in the year, you will receive a letter with details of the trip or activity. Some trips may have start times or finish times which are slightly outside of school opening and closing, so if your child relies on school buses, so please be aware that they may need dropping off or collecting on certain days. activities may require students to wear certain clothing; possibly sports wear or old clothes which may get dirty.

Friday the 18th of July is not part of the activities week. This is the final day of the academic year, and the time at which we come together as a College to reflect on the achievements of the year. Students will be expected in College as normal from morning registration until the end of P.4.

If your child is in receipt of Free School Meals, we can offer a bursary payment of up to 25% off the cost of one trip or activity. Please pay the deposit as normal to reserve a space and then email financepsf@clystvale.org to request the bursary.

## **Exam Information**



In order to help your child during the exam season, please could you remind them of the importance of the below JCQ guidelines during an examination. Your support with this would be greatly appreciated.

- 1. You must be on time for all your examinations.
- Possession of a mobile phone, smart watch or analogue watch or any other unauthorised material is not allowed even if you do not intend to use it. You will be subject to penalty and possible disqualification from the exam/qualification.
- You must not talk to, attempt to communicate with or disturb other candidates once you have entered the examination room.
- You must follow the instructions of the invigilator.
- 5. You must not sit an examination in the name of another candidate.
- You must not become involved in any unfair or dishonest practice in any part of the examination.
- 7. If you are confused about anything, only speak to an invigilator.

If you know you are going to be late to an exam, please phone us on 01392 461407 as soon as possible to let us know so we can best arrange to support your entry to the exam.

If you are unable to attend College through illness on a day when you have an examination, it is essential that an adult from your household contacts the College on 01392 461407 before 8.30am to explain the reason for your absence. In addition, please email exams@clystvale.org so that the Exams Officer knows as soon as possible.

#### STUDENT WORK





#### **Y9 Boys Country Cup Football**



## Attendance, Absence and Requests for Absence

#### **Reporting an Absence**

Parents are expected to inform us of their child's absence before 9.00 a.m. on each day of absence providing the reason for absence. If the absence continues beyond the first day, please contact the College on each subsequent day of absence, too. To comply with safeguarding obligations, we cannot simply assume a student's sickness absence is ongoing; we need to be certain that the reason for absence is due to continuing illness. If you do not notify the College, then we will make contact with you to identify the reason for absence. This is important as it helps to reduce unauthorised absences and truancy. In addition, the College may ask you to provide medical proof if your child is absent from College due to illness.

#### Lateness

The school day (first registration session) starts at 8.50 am, all students are expected to be in their classroom at this time.

### **Medical Appointments**

We encourage students to maximise their levels of attendance; research indicates a direct link between attendance and examination performance. The timing of many medical appointments means that often students can attend school first and return afterwards. By doing so, students minimise missed learning whilst keeping their attendance levels as high as possible. We ask that parents/carers send their child into school for morning registration, even when a medical appointment takes place in the middle of the morning. Similarly, appointments scheduled for the afternoon should, where possible, be arranged after Period 4 - during lunchtime. Students are encouraged to return to school after a lunchtime appointment if they can.

Please give the school as much notice as possible, at least two weeks' notice is useful.

If the appointment requires the pupil to leave during the day, they must be signed out by an adult listed on the student's record at the main reception.



As Senior Examinations Invigilator, you will be required to lead the team of invigilators conducting internal and external examinations for students, ensuring that all regulatory requirements and school policy and procedures for the conduct of examinations are strictly adhered to and met at all times. The Senior Examination Invigilator will need to be present at all exam periods and during the Summer. These months include November, December, January, March, May and June.

You will need to have previous experience as an Exams Invigilator and have an understanding of the UK Exams process. Experience in managing groups of young people would be helpful. Training will be provided. If you are calm under pressure, have a pleasant nature but a keen eye then this could be the position for you.

#### **ROOFER**

A roofer specialises in building and repairing roofs on houses and other buildings. They work with various materials, such as tiles, slate, metal, and shingles, to ensure roofs are strong, weatherproof, and long-lasting.

Roofers must be skilled in measuring and cutting materials to fit the roof's shape and size, and they need to be comfortable working at heights.

Starting roofers, or apprentices, typically earn between £17,000 and £20,000 per year as they learn the trade. With a few years of experience, a roofer's salary can increase to between £25,000 and £30,000 annually.

Highly experienced roofers, or those who take on specialised or supervisory roles, can earn upwards of £35,000 to £40,000 per year.
